Read each question carefully and try to use the correct scientific language in your answers.</li> </ul>

<b>Where can I get the information?</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• In class: The week beginning 14<sup>th</sup> October is set aside for revision in class. Your teachers will make sure you know exactly what you need to revise and you will have the chance to make revision notes that you can use at home.</li> <li>• Your homework booklets contain knowledge organisers that you can use to revise from.</li> </ul>
